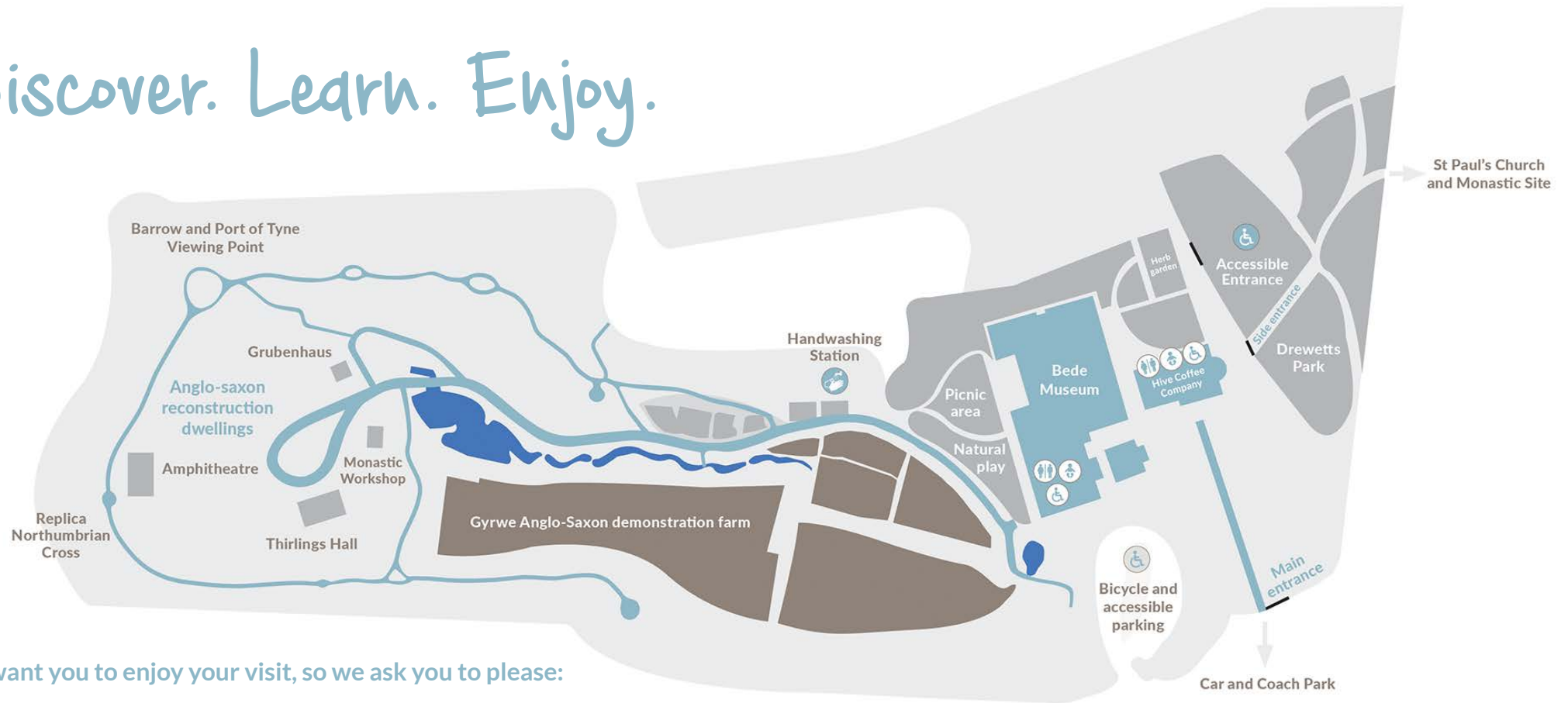
VISITOR INFORMATION

Jarrow Hall

Discover. Learn. Enjoy.



We want you to enjoy your visit, so we ask you to please:

- Keep children and any other persons requiring dedicated care under your supervision at all times - our site is very extensive and contains live animals, large exhibition spaces, deep water and dense wooded areas.
- Keep out of all animal fields and pens.
- Only feed animals the food provided and avoid hand-feeding them.
- Practice good hygiene; refrain from eating or drinking anything on the farm, and be sure to keep hands and fingers away from your mouth. Always wash your hands after spending any time on the farm, and ensure children and any other persons under your care to do this too.
- Be careful around the animals who live here; they are intelligent and have personalities of their own. In particular pigs have strong jaws and sharp teeth so keep your distance and do not attempt to touch them. Cattle and goats have large horns which can hurt you, while birds and ferrets can give a painful nip.
- Help us look after our historic and environmental oasis; recycle using the dedicated containers provided or use the general waste bins if necessary.
- Be mindful of others, and help us to ensure everyone enjoys their visit.

Hand washing

A hand washing station can be found on our farm, and facilities are also available in the Bede Museum and at Hive Coffee Company.

Dogs are welcome

All dogs must be kept accompanied and on a lead. Owners are responsible for their needs and should pick up after their dog - we can provide waste bags at the Bede Museum reception if needed. We advise against leaving your dog in your car for any period of time.
